Licensed Practical Nursing (LPN)

This disclosure is made in compliance with federal regulation 34 CFR § 668.43.

Midwestern Career College's Licensed Practical Nursing (LPN) Program is designed to prepare graduates to meet the educational requirements to pursue licensure as a Licensed Practical Nurse.

Graduates of the LPN program are eligible to apply for licensure and to sit for the National Council Licensure Examination for Practical Nurses (NCLEX-PN).

State Licensure Determination

Midwestern Career College (MCC) has determined that the curriculum of the LPN Program meets the state educational requirements for licensure as a Licensed Practical Nurse in the State of Illinois.

Licensure as a Practical Nurse in Illinois is granted by the Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation (IDFPR) upon successful completion of an approved practical nursing program and passing the NCLEX-PN examination.

MCC has not made a determination whether completion of the LPN program meets the educational requirements for licensure in states or U.S. territories other than Illinois.

Additional Licensure Requirements

In addition to educational requirements, professional licensure may require:

- Successful completion of the NCLEX-PN examination
- Criminal background checks
- Fingerprinting
- Application and licensure fees
- Continuing education requirements after licensure



These requirements are determined by the licensing authority and may change at any time. MCC's curriculum may not cover all requirements necessary for licensure.

Current and prospective students are strongly encouraged to contact the appropriate state board of nursing or licensing agencies in the state where they intend to seek licensure to obtain the most current information regarding licensure requirements.
